
NEWS LETTER INNER WHEEL CLUB OF MARLOW - JANUARY 2023

The coffee morning at the Ark has gone from strength to strength. It



Club Meetings

We have taken onboard comments you have made about the difficulties getting to and into Harleyford for Club meetings. I have had many responses from members opting for a lunchtime meeting however it seems that a few members have other commitments that can not be changed including child care and work/volunteering. So Tuesday evening stays. I will be having a meeting with the Harleyford team and will raise our concerns to see if there is a solution. We have been looking at other options.

Venues in Marlow are very limited, however Pauline Wyllie and I think we may have found a solution to the problems.

Chives (chivescatering.co.uk) is in the centre of Marlow, surrounded by offices and next to the station. It is in a well lit area with plenty of parking. It is on the level with a disabled loo. It can accommodate 45 people and offer a 2 course meal and coffee for £22. They have drinks and soft drinks available to buy. The food would be a buffet with a main and a vegetarian option. They can cater for gluten free. Dessert is from their dessert counter with cream or ice cream.



Marlow Rotary Thames have been meeting there and say the food and service has been good. Obviously this needs to be a club decision. Can I suggest you call in for a coffee there to see what you think. It is open from 7-4 but busy for breakfast and lunch. We have booked an evening there for the handover meeting in July but I think we need to think about next year.
